


The Ombudsman reports to Parliament...

It is difficult to prove but one can assume... this inhibits the actions of public servants.


They know that what they do will be open to scrutiny in a way in which they could not be scrutinised by a court.



Ombudsman Act 1973

No. 8414 of 1973

Authorised Version incorporating amendments as at 24 October 2020



A person who is duly served with a witness summons must not, without reasonable excuse, refuse or fail to comply with the witness summons.

Penalty: 240 penalty units or imprisonment for 2 years.



Ombudsman Deborah Glass advises the Government she believes she does have jurisdiction to assess electorate office funding

DECEMBER 14, 2015

Ms Glass receives a letter from Mr Jennings reiterating that the Government does not believe she has the power to probe the issue

FEBRUARY 1, 2016

Ms Glass files an application in the Supreme Court to determine whether or not she has powers to investigate
